



One and two-step wiping is suitable for cleaning all smooth, water-resistant floor coverings. Depending on requirements, routine cleaners, maintenance cleaners or surface disinfectants can be used for one and two-step cleaning. Prepared cleaning textiles are also ideal for onestep cleaning all hard, resilient and water-resistant surfaces. Pre-preparation eliminates dirt being carried over from the dirty cleaning solution. It also prevents germs from being transferred. As such, this application method is ideal for use in hygiene-relevant areas.

One-step wiping:



Step 1: Preparation

Stack furniture where necessary. Sweep or use a damp cloth (gauze cloth) to remove coarse, loose dirt.



Step 2: Dose, prepare ready-to-use solution

First add water, then add the correct amount of detergent, following the dosage instructions on the label. Always use cold water!

Follow operating instructions. Wear personal protective equipment.











Step 3: Wipe the surface systematically

Place warning signs!

Submerge mop in a blue bucket and wring out. Wipe the edge areas first, then clean the surfaces in overlapping loops (figures of 8). Rinse the dirty mop in the red bucket and wring out. Then submerge in the blue bucket, wring out and wipe the next section of floor.





Step 4: Clean tools

Properly dispose of the dirty solution, rinse out the bucket and then clean with a damp cloth. Rinse soiled mops thoroughly and then wash in the laundry machine.

Two-step wiping:



Step 1: Preparation

Stack furniture where necessary. Sweep or use a damp cloth (gauze cloth) to remove coarse, loose dirt.











Step 2: Dose, prepare ready-to-use solution

First add water, then add the correct amount of detergent, following the dosage instructions on the label. Always use cold water!

Follow operating instructions. Wear personal protective equipment.





Step 3: Rinse mop

Rinse mop in the red bucket and wring out. Then rinse the mop in the blue bucket and gently wring out over the red bucket.



Step 4: Systematic wiping of the surface

Place warning signs!

Wipe the edge areas first, then clean the surfaces in overlapping loops (figures of 8). Rinse dirty mop as described in Step 3 and wring out well. Absorb any moisture with this thoroughly wrung-out mop.











Step 5: Clean tools

Properly dispose of the dirty solution, rinse out the bucket and then clean with a damp cloth. Rinse soiled mops thoroughly and then wash in the laundry machine.

Wipe with pre-prepared mops. Step 1: Prepare cleaning textiles



Manual rinsing of the textiles

Place mops in box. Prepare cleaning solution into a measuring cup and pour over the specified amount of cleaning solution.







Semi-automated preparation of textiles

Place mops in box. Place box under the dosing unit discharge hose. Press the start button and submerge mops in cleaning solution.





ProMop System



Open laundry machine and place the prepared mops in the corresponding boxes.



Step 2: Preparation

Stack furniture where necessary. Sweep or use a damp cloth (gauze cloth) to remove coarse, loose dirt.









Step 3: Systematic wiping of the surface

Place warning signs!

Attach mop.

Lay "waterway".

Clean the surface in overlapping loops (figure of 8). Use fresh mop if necessary





Step 4: Clean tools

After finishing work, empty, clean and, where applicable, disinfect boxes. Mops should be washed with laundry.
